RMS Update—Woolgoolga to Ballina upgrade project - Speed zone changes

To manage safety for all road users between Glenugie and Tyndale, the speed limit for all motorists on sections of Coldstream, Tyndale Tucabia and Wooli roads will be reduced from 100 kilometres an hour to a maximum of 80 kilometres an hour from Tuesday 16 May 2017.

The reduced 80 kilometre speed limit will extend from the intersection of Coldstream Road and the Pacific Highway at Tyndale to an area north of the Tucabia township and again south of the township to about 400 metres north of Whites Bridge on Wooli Road. The reduced speed limit will apply until completion of the Woolgoolga to Ballina Pacific Highway upgrade by 2020 and will contribute to improved safety conditions for project workers and all road users. Variable and permanent signs will be installed advising motorists of the speed reduction.

In the interest of safety, speed limits at key locations where construction vehicles are entering local roads from the project site will continue to be reduced during construction hours to 60 kilometres or 40 kilometres an hour to suit the local road conditions. Traffic control will be in place to direct and manage traffic at these key locations and intersections. The project team will also install new centre linemarking in various locations on Coldstream and Wooli roads to further guide driver behaviour. The project team will continue to work with Clarence Valley Council and local highway patrol to monitor the interaction of local and construction vehicles on the Pacific Highway and local road network.

We thank you for your patience during this important work and ask for your continued cooperation in keeping to speed limits and following the direction of traffic controllers.
