Bullying

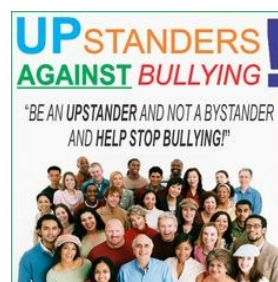
As part of our ongoing commitment to positive student welfare and wellbeing at Tucabia PS the Student Welfare Policy now contains components that specifically focus on bullying.

The key to any productive welfare and wellbeing policy is having a clear, structured education component that ensures all students are taught the skills to be happy and successful members of the school community and therefore the wider community too.

We have developed systematic lessons that build student confidence and self worth, that allow them to identify bullying and develop the skills needed to take positive action if they are witness to bullying.

The cornerstone of our policy is the national definition of bullying for Australian schools says:

- Bullying is an ongoing misuse of power in relationships through repeated verbal, physical and/or social behaviour that causes physical and/or psychological harm. It can involve an individual or a group misusing their power over one or more persons. Bullying can happen in person or online, and it can be obvious (overt) or hidden (covert).*
- Bullying of any form or for any reason can have long-term effects on those involved, including bystanders.*
- Single incidents and conflict or fights between equals, whether in person or online, are not defined as bullying.*
