Social Emotional Learning

Next term we will be introducing a program called Second Steps. This program will help us teach vital social and emotional skills at school and we also aim to build a strong partnership with parents and community to develop these skills in all areas of our kids lives.

Social Emotional Learning (SEL) is a crucial aspect of growing up that helps individuals, both young and old, develop important skills and attitudes. It focuses on:

- **Self-awareness**: Recognising your strengths and weaknesses while maintaining confidence and a positive mindset.
- **Self-management**: Managing stress, controlling impulses, and setting and achieving goals.
- **Social awareness:** Understanding and empathising with others, especially those from different backgrounds.
- **Relationship skills:** Communicating effectively, listening, cooperating with others, handling social pressures, resolving conflicts, and seeking help when necessary.
- **Responsible decision-making:** Making positive choices in behaviour and social interactions based on ethics, safety, and social norms.

SEL promotes equity and excellence in education by creating supportive partnerships between schools, families, and communities, fostering environments that encourage collaboration and meaningful learning experiences. There will be more information very early next term on what this looks like at school and how you can support the building and use of the skills in all areas of your childrens lives.

Child Care Subsidy

Did you know that if you're eligible for the Child Care Subsidy (CCS), the amount you pay in fees could be reduced by up to 90%?

- Families earning \$83,280 or less will get 90% subsidy.
- Families earning over \$83,280 and under \$533,280 will get a subsidy that tapers down from 90%, depending on their income. The subsidy will go down 1% for each \$5,000 earned.
 Getting assessed for CCS is EASY and could SAVE you money on Out Of School Hours Care.
